As a reminder, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube all have a minimum age for users of 13 years old. Whatsapp, has a minimum age for users of 16 years old. We would kindly ask that if your children have accounts on these sites that you investigate this and act accordingly. We want to keep all of the children at Connor Downs as safe as possible.
