This week year 5 enjoyed a visit to the Nexus campus as part of their



science topic "No Way Back". The children had the opportunity to observe reversible and irreversible changes from cooking an egg to lighting bubbles of methane gas. After learning about how to stay safe in the lab, the children had the chance to use Bunsen burners to set a wooden splint alight and



record their observations. Finally, the children worked in small groups with a

variety of substances to classify whether a reversible or irreversible change had taken place by observing heat,
