HEAD OF SCHOOL UPDATE

On Thursday of last week, our year 3 children visited Penlee Museum to link with their current history topic focussing on the stone age. The children explored a timeline of the different stone age periods, asking many relevant questions. They developed their knowledge of new vocabulary such as Mesolithic and Palaeolithic. Thank you to the parents/carers for supporting the children with their stone age vocabulary in spelling and reading comprehension homework, it helped to reinforce the children's learning and support their understanding in the museum. It was wonderful to see the children investigating replicas of stone age and iron age tools such as arrow heads and clay pots. After they left the museum, year 3 travelled to Carn Euny near Penzance to explore a real Iron Age settlement.



On Tuesday, year 4 had a fantastic day at the Maritime Museum in Falmouth learning information about the Vikings journeys, Viking trading and even how to make a Viking coin. The children investigated how Vikings used the wind power to sail their mighty longships across the oceans. They were then given an opportunity to steer boats on the boating pool using the wind to help. In the afternoon, the children had the opportunity to explore the rest of the museum and even had the chance to learn more about the famous ship 'Titantic'. Alan summed it up perfectly stating, 'Today has been a great day!' It certainly was!

On Tuesday a selection of our Y4 and Y6 girls attended Phoenix gymnastics club to take part in a competition organised by CSIA. The girls did themselves proud, competing against some very strong gymnasts from local schools.
