Year 5 - Music


In July, Year 5 will be attending a Music Fiesta being held at Hayle

entering the water for a morning session and a short session




after lunch. The children had so much fun and some of the more experienced surfers within the group managed to 'catch a wave!' – what an accomplishment.

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


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M & M Theatrical Productions – The Jungle Book
