Dear parents/carers,

I hope that you and your families are well. We have had another busy and fun packed week in school.

This week in Reception, the children chose to focus on 'Supertato: Run, Veggies, Run!' by Sue Hendra. This led to some fantastic discussions centred around healthy choices and



the importance of exercise.

In the story, the vegetables take part in an exciting sports day. This inspired us to host our very own EYFS sports day! The children enjoyed taking part in a selection of races and games,

as well as learning new vocabulary linked to the day's events.

One pupil explained, "I like P.E. because it makes you fit and strong. I liked the relay race because I passed the baton to my friends."







In Year 5, as part of our SCARF (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience, Friendship) activities we examined several scenarios around bullying and internet safety. The children compared and contrasted the behaviour of the people in each case and suggested ways to resolve the situation. The children then worked in pairs to complete a Venn diagram of words that are

used to describe bullying and cyberbullying. Finally, the class discussed strategies for dealing with cyberbullying and where to find support.

Road Closure - Treeve Lane

A reminder that part of Treeve Lane between Parc Upton Farm and No. 39 Treeve Lane will be closed from Monday 10th May until Friday 30th July 2021. This will mean that the road outside of Connor Downs Academy will be taking more 'heavy traffic' both accessing the essential works, but also from CIB Lello Plant Hire, whose lorries and machinery



usually access their yard using the road down to Hayle rather than past the school. South West Water and the contractor Glanvilles, are working with the school and local residents to ensure the impact of the essential works is kept to a minimum.

Staff in school will be reminding children of the importance of road safety, particularly during this time. We would be very grateful if parent/carers could remind their children of road safety in preparation for the commencement of this work.

Social Media/Online Gaming

As an academy, we recognise that social media is playing an ever-expanding role in our day to day lives. It is important that children start to experience this in a suitably supervised and age appropriate way. As a reminder, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube all have a minimum age for users of 13 years old. Whatsapp, has a minimum age for users of 16 years old. We would also like to remind you that whilst certain gaming platforms may have an internet safety age of 7+, if used inappropriately these can lead to children feeling ostracised and we would kindly ask all parents/carers of children who access these games to monitor this usage very carefully.





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COVID-19 Asymptomatic Staff Testing Programme Across Aspire Academies

about light and shadow, especially her explanations about night and day.










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Year 4 - Navarre
