
I hope that you and your families are all safe and well. We have had another incredibly busy and exciting week in our academy.

> to grow and adapt and trying new things can help us to move beyond our comfort zone into a new realm of possibility and potential.


In Reception class this week the children have been discussing their different feelings and emotions. They talked about how they can help themselves and others if they have worries. They listened to a story and also had lots of

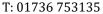


Year 5/6 Football Festival at Hayle Academy

This week in year 1 linking to our topic 'To The Rescue' we had some special visitors from the RNLI. During the session we learnt what RNLI stands for, what the flag looks like and that the Queen is in charge of the RNLI. We also learnt about the different flags and what they mean when visiting the beach. We then reenacted a rescue scenario. We had children that needed rescuing, lifeguards, a swimmer and rescuers on

The final Science lesson caused great excitement as the children used vinegar and bicarbonate of soda to create volcanic eruptions.












Year 5 – Great Fire of London

Year 5 invited Year 2 to watch their reconstruction of the Great Fire of London. The

fire started off in the bakery and the children watched it spread from house to house along their "Pudding Lane". In the classroom, the children linked this to how the fire spread in 1666. In a link with science, the children investigated the fire triangle and discussed the rules of fire safety.









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Year 6 – Fabulous Fossils

This week, Year 6 have created some beautiful prints of fossils. Firstly, they created some line studies in their sketchbooks and then chose their final design. The end result looks amazing!





Year 6

The children in year 6 watched a video produced for the NSPCC as part of their 'Share Aware' campaign. The video, using animation that combines a light humerous touch while conveying a serious message focussed on the importance of not sharing information or pictures on the internet that are not appropriate. It depicts two boys messing around with smartphones and sending an inappropriate picture to a friend on a picture sharing app that automatically deletes the photo within a few seconds. It shows just how easily this can be be shared around with people that are complete strangers.



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Year 5

As part of the SCARF PHSE programme, the children in Year 5 discussed the similarities and differences between bullying and cyber bullying and recorded their answers on a Venn diagram. The children also discussed several scenarios and decided whether the case study was bullying and what action should be taken

Year 4

In Year 4, we celebrated Safer Internet Day by watching the virtual assembly and answering the quiz questions. This built on work we did in

the Autumn Term where we were thinking about being respectful online.

Daisy is enthusiastic and hardworking every day. She approaches all activities with a smile and a positive attitude. Dasiy has also made huge improvements during Bikeability.




Year 1 - Harriet

For her fantastic effort and ideas during our SCARF lessons. Harriet is a great role model to her friends, is very kind, caring and helpful.




For excellent maths reasoning and problem solving during our unit on statistics.
