Children's Mental Health Week



This week children in school and at home have focused on Children's mental health week. The theme of this year's Children's Mental Health Week is **Express Yourself**. Expressing yourself is about finding ways to share feelings, thoughts, or ideas, through creativity. This could be through art, music, writing and poetry, dance and drama, photography and film, and doing activities that make you feel good.



Some examples of creativity this week were the Year 5 children expressing their feelings and emotions through art.

The Year R children expressed kindness by sharing bunches of daffodils with other pods in school. This act of kindness brought big smiles to everyone's faces.

Year 6 created their own 'Nature Bingo' cards and enjoyed running around spotting them. Some were easy – such as 'find a green leaf', whilst others were much more





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challenging – 'spot two seagulls in the sky'. They enjoyed it so much, year 6 shared their game with the other KS2 classes. A brilliant way to enjoy the outside!



SumDog – The Aspire Academy Trust Contest

The Aspire Academy Trust SumDog Contest is here!

Between 08:00 today and 20:00 on Thursday February 11th, your child/children can take part in the contest.



- Your child/children can play at any time.
- For their score to count, the 'The Aspire Academy Trust' activity must be showing in the green panel on the left of your child/children's screen when they click to start each game.
- Their scores are based on correct answers and a class's score will be the average of the scores from all students within that class who take part.
- To appear on the leader board, at least five children from a class need to take part.
- Every child is limited to 1000 contest questions, to allow those with limited computer access the ability to take part.

Friday 12th February INSET day (school closed to all pupils)

As previously advised, on Friday 12th February school is closed to all pupils for a planned Trust INSET staff training day. INSET days are established diary dates in any given academic year and the Trust has retained this date to ensure professional development and teaching and learning best practice continues across all our academies. Connor Downs Academy will be closed to all pupils, including those of critical workers and vulnerable children. During this time, class teachers will set a creative challenge, which will not require a device, which your child/children can take part in if they choose.

Half Term

Aspire academies will be closed to ALL pupils, including critical workers/vulnerable pupils, from w/c 15th February for half term and will reopen to critical worker/vulnerable pupils on Monday 22nd February. Eligible Free School Meals families will receive a Wonde voucher to cover the half term period.





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Full or Wider opening date

In his Downing Street briefing last Wednesday, the Prime Minister announced that he is hopeful that schools could reopen from Monday 8th March, but this is by no means a confirmed date. At this point in time, there is no detail on the proposed 'road map' for return. Planning for wider opening will begin in liaison with the Trust as soon as details begin to emerge and we will keep you informed.

COVID-19 Asymptomatic Staff Testing Programme Across Aspire Academies

Every primary school in England now has access to rapid coronavirus testing for staff only. This testing, known as lateral flow testing, for our staff, is now taking place twice a week.

Please be aware that in a positive test scenario, you may receive communication of a bubble closure (if your child is in school) at extremely short notice, before school, on the morning of the closure. You will be informed by text so please check your text messages from 8am onwards on a Monday and a Thursday morning.



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
Year 4 – Mason
