Dear parents/carers,

Equally, dropping your child/children to school during a pandemic is a difficult task too. Together, we will aim to make this current lockdown as manageable and as purposeful in terms of learning outcomes as we can. As mentioned last week in our newsletter, our aim with the home learning is to replicate, as far as is possible, the English and maths provision which is taking place in school each day. This is to ensure parity of provision for children in school and at home. The focus of home learning during the lockdown is to sustain learning and maintain our high standards of progress and attainment.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your many positive comments regarding the in school and at home provision.

Telephone calls home

For those of you supporting your child/children at home, you will have noticed this week that a member of staff from your child's/children's class, will have telephoned to keep in touch with you.

The purpose of these calls are three fold.

Firstly, to sustain connectivity between home and school which we know from the previous lockdown, is an important factor in keeping our school community united and also our parents/carers and children united with their class teacher and support staff.

Secondly, to check that you and your child/children are well.

Thirdly, to discuss the home learning access, content and engagement and address any concerns which you or your child/children may have encountered.

The feedback from the telephone calls this week has been very positive and this is a model which we will adopt in the forthcoming weeks during lockdown.

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We appreciate, that for our parents/carers who are working shifts, you may not appreciate a call during a rest period. Please do inform your child/children's class teacher via Tapestry for Year R and Year 1 or Google Classroom for Years 2-6, of suitable times to receive a call. Thank you.

Access to devices

Thank you for your responses to the questionnaire sent our last week regarding your access to devices at home to support your child/children's home learning. I am pleased to inform you that the DfE funding will enable us to provide devices for families who require them. We anticipate taking delivery of these devices at some point next week, and as soon as they have been set up by our IT team, we will contact families to arrange collection.



For super research and writing a fact file about Koalas and a fantastic drawing as well. Well Done Theo!




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Kerra always shows kindness and generosity towards others and has an intense curiosity that she brings to all her learning. Keep it up Kerra!
