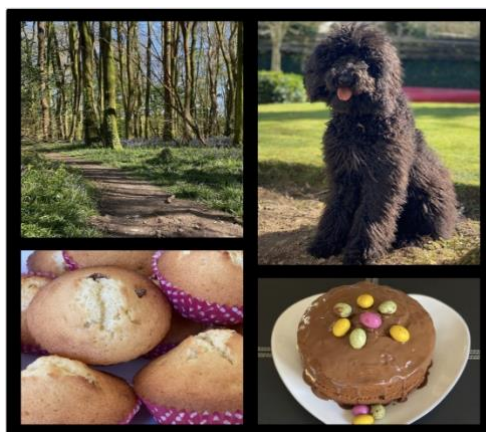



Here are some of the things we have been busy doing over the Easter!



Theme Activities

Our new topic is going to be finding out about 2 very famous queens. Queen Victoria who was queen from 1837 to 1901 (65 years) and our present queen, Queen Elizabeth II.

- Can you draw pictures and write descriptions of Queen Elizabeth.
 - Please watch together at home - the TV news and check other media for news items about the royal family and then discuss the types of events and activities that the royal family are involved in. You could also create a scrapbook or produce a collage display.
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- You can create a wall display to show the family tree of Queen Elizabeth and trace it back to Queen Victoria
 - Look at pictures of royal jewels and if possible see them being worn– eg <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TSyLLWZ5jp8> (shows the Imperial State Crown – worn by Victoria and Elizabeth II) or <http://www.telegraph.co.uk/news/uknews/queen-elizabeth-II/10091742/Queens-coronation-60th-anniversary-watch-colour-highlights-of-1953-ceremony.html> showing the coronation
 - Can you design and make some crowns or tiaras suitable for a queen or princess – or a crown for a king or prince.
 - Also, you could look at the royal homes and palaces and mark them on a map.

Challenge 1-Design your Perfect Pasty

What does this challenge involve?

Challenge 4- Design a board/card game.

Design a card/board game in any style you want, you'll need a core concept, a set of rules and a board and/or cards, you may also want to design a logo or box for your game. There is no requirement to physically make any of your items but it may earn you more points. Be creative and have fun; enjoyable, inventive and impressive games will earn the most points.



The Royal Game of Ur also known as the Game of Twenty Squares: this two-player strategy game dates from the early third millennium BC and is likely the world's oldest board game.



Diplomacy: this strategy game was first designed in 1954 to model historical European war and diplomacy, players use cunning, strategy and betrayal to try to become the master of Europe.



Uno: an American card game based on the traditional card game Crazy Eights; players compete to get rid of their cards faster than their competitors.
