We have had another busy and exciting week in the academy.

Year 5



This week both groups from year 5 began their Bikeability training.

This was their first session of three and took place in the school playground. This allows the instructors to assess the children's cycling skills prior to taking them out on the road. Over the next two sessions the children will be taken on the roads by the instructors.



Also in year 5 this week the children have been learning about forces and friction. The children learned how to read scales on a Newton meter before investigating the force required to pull their sleds across different surfaces. Their results were recorded in a table and the children wrote their conclusion based on their findings.



Government's COVID-19 Winter Plan

The current national restrictions will be lifted on Wednesday 2nd December and will be replaced by the COVID-19 Winter Plan. These new rules come into effect from 00:01 on Wednesday 2nd December and confirm that:

- The policy in England is that education settings will remain open in all tiers DfE will update its guidance to reflect how settings should operate under the
 strengthened tier system, and an updated contingency framework in the
 exceptional circumstances in which further restrictions on education are
 required in any area.
- The government will continue piloting further rapid testing in schools, colleges and universities, and will deploy rapid testing for specific one-off events.
- The Winter plan makes clear that schools and trusts should not change their Christmas holidays or close early this term.
