
Dear parents/carers,

The children were very interested in their learning and wanted to share their learning experiences with the visitors. They were proud of their learning and their achievements. The children could see the relevance of their learning.


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


### **Armistice Day**



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

For creating a colourful and unique camouflage poppy. Eryss has settled well into Year 3 and demonstrates fantastic behaviour for learning. Well done Eryss!



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
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
### Year 4 - Charley
