I hope that you and your families are safe and well. We have had another busy and exciting week in our academy.

Year 5 – Nexus Fish & Chips





This week, Year 5 attended the Nexus campus of Camborne Science and International Academy to take part in a science workshop on Rock Salt. Rock salt is a rock made up of sediment (sand, small rock and salt crystals

(sodium chlorine)). The children had to remove the dirt and rocks form the salt by grinding the rock salt to very fine pieces with a pestle and mortar, then adding this to 20ml of water and stirring to make all the salt dissolve in the water. This left them with salt water. The next step was to separate the salt from the muddy water. They did this using a funnel made from filtering paper. The filtering paper is a paper that has lots of very small holes in it that only lets water through.

After this filtering, the water had turned from a muddy puddle to crystal clear water. From this salt water they had to use a Bunsen Burner to dissolve the water which left the salt. After around 6 – 8 minutes, the clear water turned to salt, which amazed all the children. They were all



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fascinated to learn that a mixture is when two or more particles are mixed together but not chemically bonded to each

other. Thank you to Senara for her brilliant recount of the workshop. We would like to also thank Nexus for the

opportunity to take part in another of their



fantastic workshops and Mrs Allen, Mrs Kevern and Mrs Sleeman for supporting the visit.
