### COVID-19 Asymptomatic Staff Testing Programme Across Aspire Academies

You will be informed by text so please check your text messages from 8am onwards on a Monday and a Thursday morning.

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#### Covid update

Thank you for your ongoing support with following Covid guidance. Since March 2020, when we experienced our first lockdown, your support in adhering to Covid measures has been tremendous. This has enabled our school to run smoothly and our children to be able to access their education, with no bubble closures to date. The government has updated their Step 4 guidance this week. The Trust have fully reviewed this document and attached with this newsletter is a letter from Mrs Bragg,, CEO of Aspire, sharing our plans for opening from Monday 19th July 2021 until the end of this academic term.

Essentially, what this means for us is:

- The staggered drop offs and pick ups which are currently in place will continue to the end of term
- The bubbles will remain intact
- The children will continue to have lunches in their classrooms
- The staff will continue to provide learning following their current timetables
- Face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas (Again, should there be a local outbreak this may be reintroduced for a fixed time period). However, all parents/carers and staff continue to have the right to wear face coverings in communal areas, should they decide to, based on their own personal circumstances.
- Social distancing however, remains important and I would kindly ask all parents/carers to continue to adhere to social distancing measures. Thank you.

### From Tuesday 7th September

- No class bubbles required (However please be aware that moving forward should there be a local outbreak bubbles may be reintroduced for a fixed time period)
- All children to arrive on the school site between 8.30am and 8.45am when the green gates will close.
- All children to be collected/dismissed at 3.15pm
- To ease congestion on site, the following drop off and collection points will remain in place:

- Assemblies can resume including Shine assemblies.
- Lunchtime mixing can resume and school meals/packed lunches to be eaten in the school hall.
- Schools are no longer required to trace contacts. Contacts from a school
  setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case
  specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. This is likely to be
  a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting
  COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact.
- Face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas (Again, should there be a local outbreak this may be reintroduced for a fixed time period). However, all parents/carers and staff continue to have the right to wear face coverings in communal areas, should they decide to, based on their own personal circumstances.

#### <u>Additional/September Guidance</u>

- From 16th August, children under the age of 18 and double vaccinated staff are no longer required to self-isolate if they are a close contact of a positive COVID case. Instead of isolation NHS Test and Trace will contact all close contacts and advise them to take a PCR test.
- If we were to experience several confirmed Covid cases within 14 days, we
  may have an outbreak. If there is an outbreak in a setting or if central
  government offers the area an enhanced response package, a director of
  public health might advise a setting to temporarily reintroduce some control
  measures.
- Control measures required in schools have now been reduced to:

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- 1. **Ensure good hygiene for everyone** We will ensure that pupils clean their hands regularly. This can be done with soap and water.
- 2. **Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.** High use staff areas such as staffrooms and shared communal areas will be cleaned thoroughly.
- 3. **Keep occupied spaces well ventilated** When school is in operation, it is important to ensure it is well ventilated and that a comfortable teaching environment is maintained. When holding events where visitors such as parents/carers are on site, for example school plays, the environment used will be well ventilated whilst maintaining a comfortable temperature.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19 Pupils, staff and other adults should follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. They should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine).
- Remote Education This will be provided for children who need to self-isolate because they have tested positive, to complete at home, if they are well enough to do so.

For showing perseverance and enthusiasm during the Reception class Sports Day. Amelia is a true team player.




### Year 1 - Carter
