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


Year 4 Visit to Kresen Kernow

On Wednesday, Year 4 visited Kresen Kernow, the home of Cornwall's archives. They were given a tour of the strongroom, where there are 14 miles of historical documents, and saw records from Bodmin Gaol. The children discovered the history of the site (an old brewery) and investigated exhibits. They took part in a mock trial as part of their crime and punishment topic and researched two of the prisoners from Bodmin Gaol who had been sentenced to death in 1840. Everybody

enjoyed the trip; it was a great way to end our topic and to relate what the children have learned to their local area.

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


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Year R - Harrison

For excellent skills in making a St Piran's flag, teaching his friend how to measure and make the flag. Well done Finley!


