Dear parents/carers,

I hope that you and your families are safe and well. We have had an incredibly busy and exciting final week of this half term. On behalf of myself and all the staff at Connor Downs Academy, we wish you all a lovely, half term break and look forward to welcoming the children back to school on **Monday 3rd June 2024**.



<u>Year 6 – Group 3</u>

Last Friday afternoon the final Year 6 outdoor learning group visited Copperhouse pool nature reserve and King George V memorial walk. They began the nature trail with a discussion about why and when the memorial walk was developed, and what it was previously used for.

During the trail they stopped off at key points, using binoculars to observe the variety of wildlife including the many species of birds that visit the reserve. The children

used a compass to understand direction and why this location is ideal for the growth of unusual plant species. They also learnt some history of this area including how the waste product from the copper industry

was used to build many walls and buildings, which they were able to observe during the trail.

Finally, they discussed the nature quiz and ensured they all understood to appreciate how these unique landscapes offer important habitats for

wildlife. This visit complements their previous visit to the dunes, focusing on local and contrasting





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landscapes within our local area.

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Year 3 – Outdoor Learning

During their session on Monday with Mr Costello, the Year 3 outdoor learning group took part in a pond dipping exercise, discovering what lives in the pond, observing them closely and comparing amphibians to



Science morning

Year 3 had a great Science morning when they carried out an investigation in how to make a rainbow grow. Linked to their previous learning about capillary action in plant stems, the children worked with parents to set up the

experiment and observe the rainbow grow.

The children were thrilled as the rainbows started to absorb the water and change colour.

It was lovely to see the children working in teams and sharing their learning with the parents.

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Year 5 were studying the legacy and impact of David Attenborough.
