HEAD OF SCHOOL UPDATE

Welcome back after the half term break, we hope that you enjoyed your week.

On Tuesday, we hosted our Spring term monitoring visit, where we welcomed leaders from other Aspire academies, in addition to our Hub Councillors. This was once again, a hugely positive experience, giving us the opportunity to showcase the fantastic learning taking place in all of our classes. We were again praised on the exceptional behaviour of all the children of whom we are so proud.

The children in year 3 are fortunate to be working on the Percy Pengelly Project. On Wednesday morning, they had their first workshop with the choreographer. The children were busy learning dance steps in readiness for their performance at Tremenheere Gardens, Penzance at the end of March.

Also on Wednesday, Year 5 really enjoyed their educational visit to Tolvaddon

Fire Station. The children worked with a variety of services to learn vital life skills to stay safe and help others. With the Cornwall Fire and Rescue Service the children investigated an accident and found that using a mobile phone contributed to the accident. Working with the Tri-Service Safety the children performed CPR on a 'Resus Anne doll'. The British Transport Police and GWR staff used their "Rail Safety Box" to teach children about crime and safety on the railway and just how dangerous it is

being on the tracks. The Devon and Cornwall
Police focused on the dangers of internet safety and
age restrictions. Cornwall Council Parking educated
the children about safe parking outside schools and the
children investigated their state-of-the-art patrol car.
Year 5 would like to thank Mrs Freestone for driving the
children and supporting the visit.


