Breakdown of spending.	Sports coach – £15,298 Resources - £2,922
Impact of spending. (P.E. and sport participation)	Participation remains at 100% from Year 1-6 for co-operative sports activities. All children in these years get the opportunity to participate in a sporting festival alongside other schools. There has been an increase in numbers playing competitive sport for the academy with the introduction of girls football and tri golf this year, as well as increasing the number of cricket and rugby teams participating in competitions. We have also taken 32 runners to cross country; double the number that was taken to last year's event. KS1 have this year attended two sporting festivals; double what they attended last year.
Impact of spending. (Pupil attainment)	A PE specialist has worked alongside the Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 teacher. This specialist has planned, taught and assessed a range of sports and P.E lessons alongside the class teacher. This ensures that the children receive high quality sport teaching and the class teacher and support staff receive CPD of model lessons and how to plan and evaluate each session.
Sustainability of improvements.	The CPD provided by the sports specialist is upskilling the teachers in the teaching of PE. It has also had a positive impact on the uptake we have for clubs because children are now more enthused about their sports lessons.
