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# Year 4 - Science

In Year 4 for Science Week, the children have been looking at this year's topic of Growth. They completed a reading comprehension as well as investigated their own questions about growth. Some of the things that the class have investigated are:

- Which tree is the tallest?
- Which microbes grow the quickest?
- Which is the oldest animal?

We have also been working on investigating which materials are best for making ear protectors to protect our ears from loud sounds.


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# Minack Theatre – Easter Holidays
